Guidance note on small numbers

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) used a process called statistical disclosure control to ensure no individuals could be identified in any published 2011 Census tables. ONS swapped some Census records between different areas to protect information supplied by individuals. In practice, this means where a result is a small number, there is an uncertainty as to whether this is a true value.

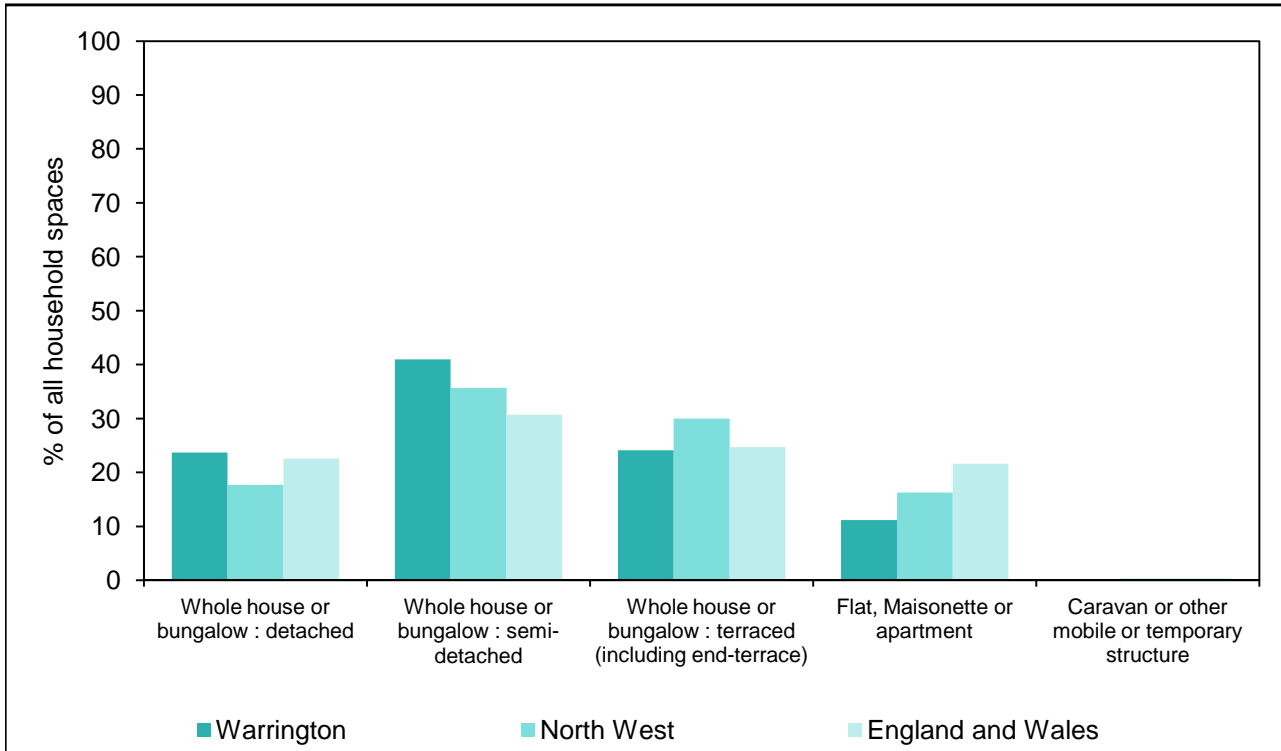
Accommodation type

This table shows the number of different types of accommodation. The base of the table is household spaces. For 2011 Census purposes, a household space is the accommodation used or available for use by an individual household. Household spaces differ to dwellings as more than one household can live in a single dwelling.

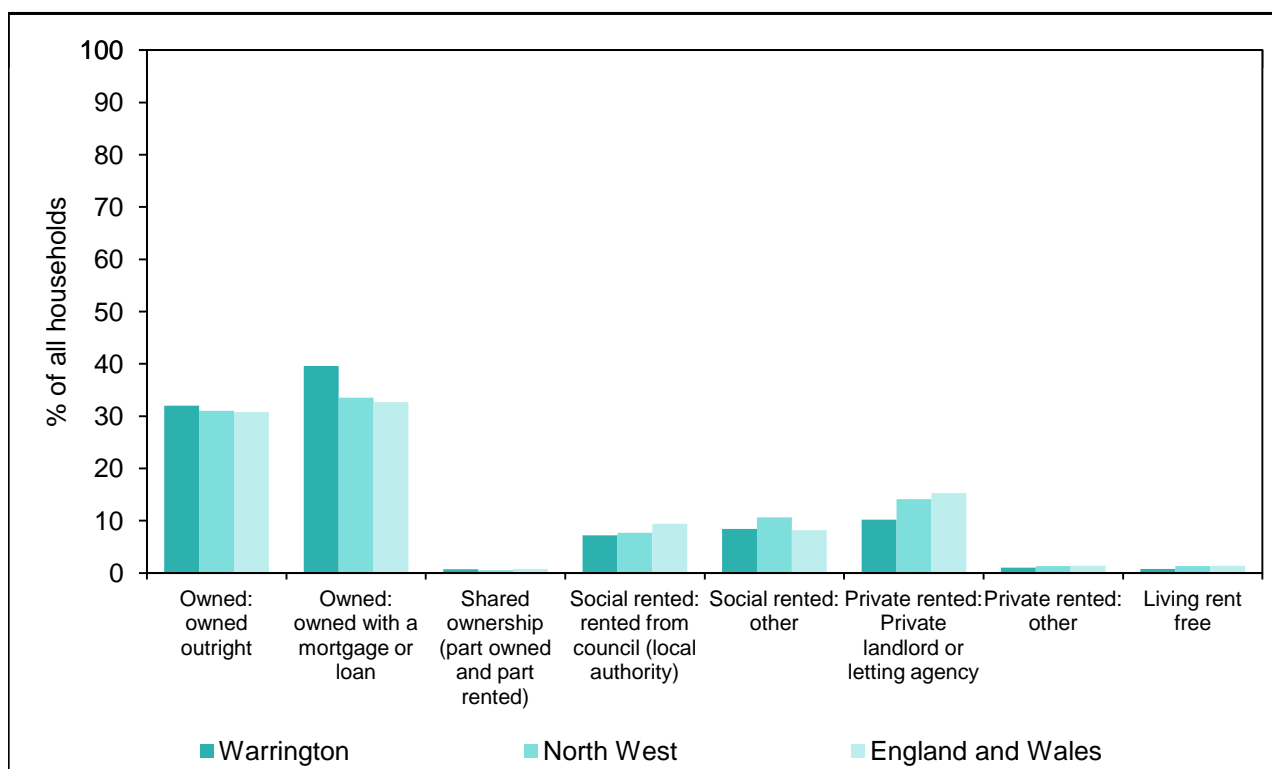
Tenure

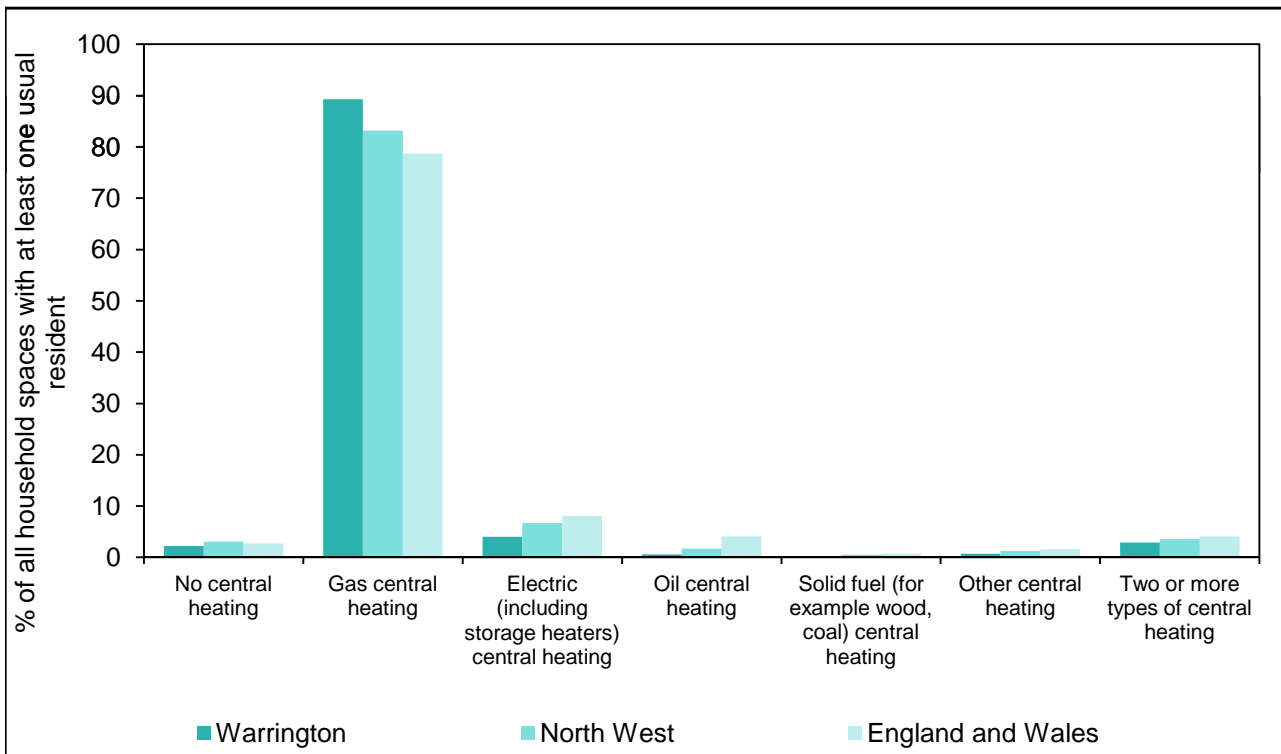

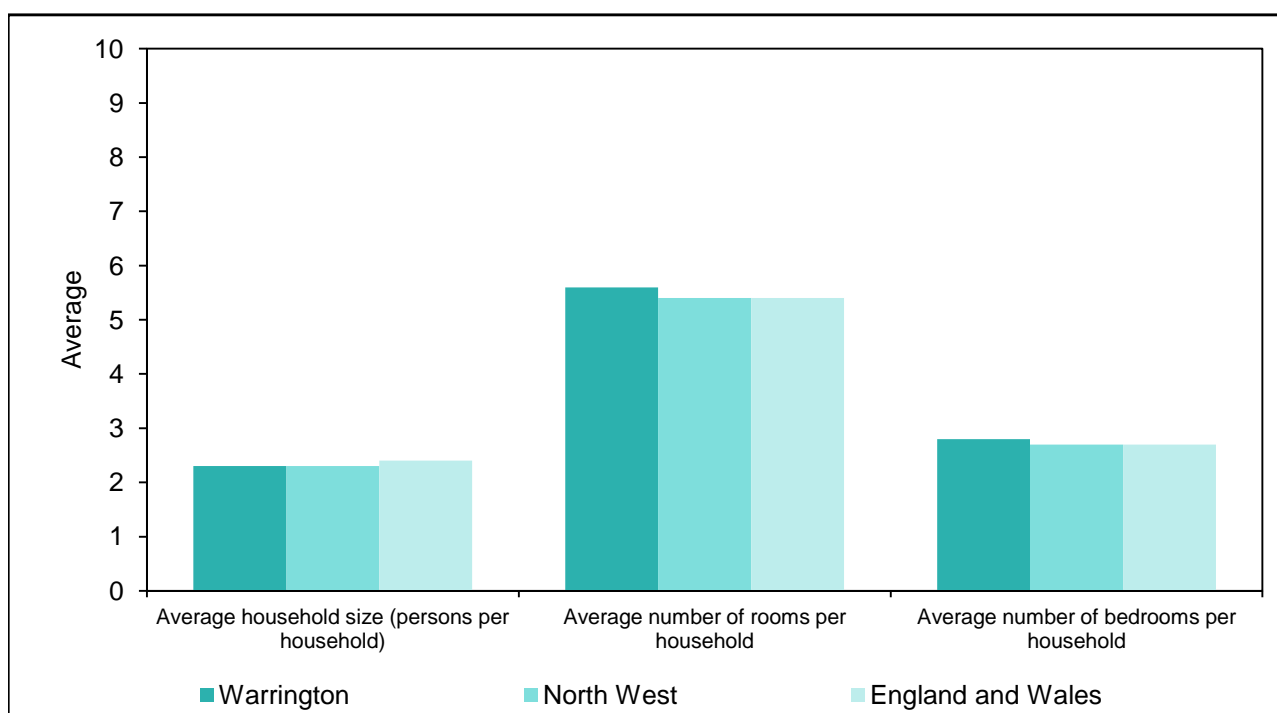
Number of rooms and occupancy rating

This table shows the average number of people, rooms and bedrooms per household. The table also provides information on occupancy rating which is a measure of whether a household's accommodation is overcrowded or under occupied. The ages of the household members and their relationships to each other are used to derive the number of rooms/bedrooms they require, based on a standard formula. The number of rooms/bedrooms required is subtracted from the number of rooms/bedrooms in the household's accommodation to obtain the occupancy rating. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that a household has one fewer room/bedroom than required (i.e. is overcrowded)

Chart 4: Average household size and average number of rooms per household



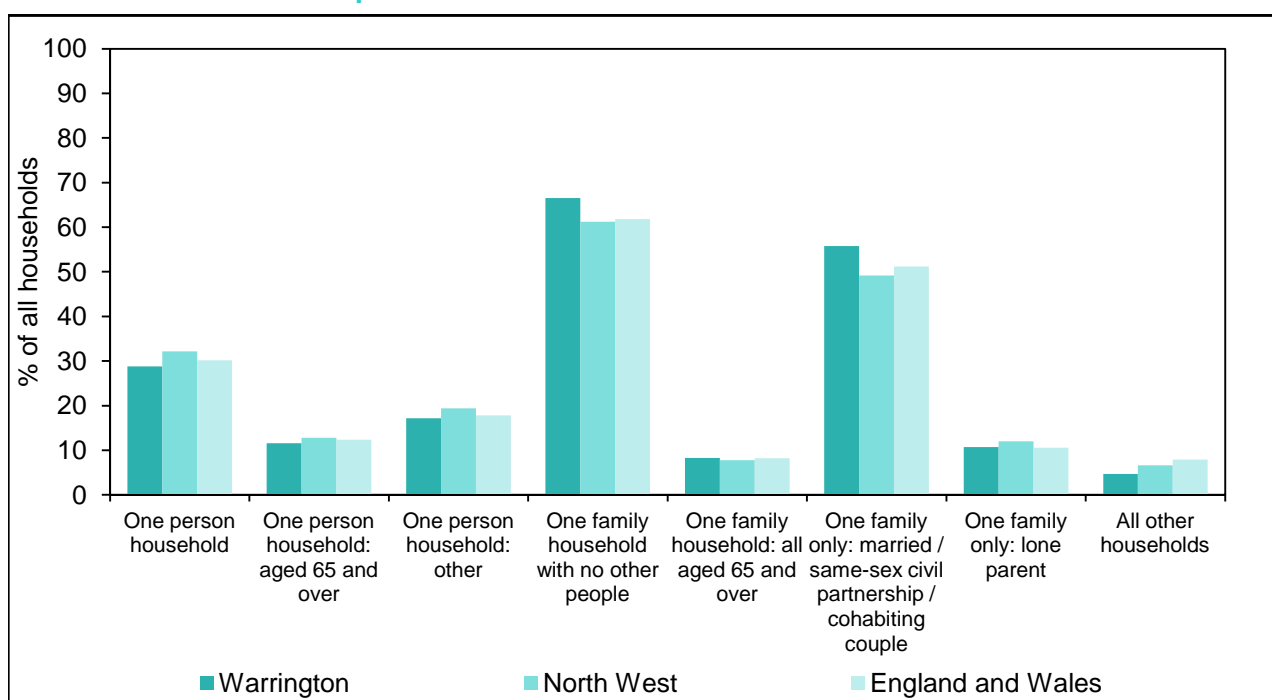

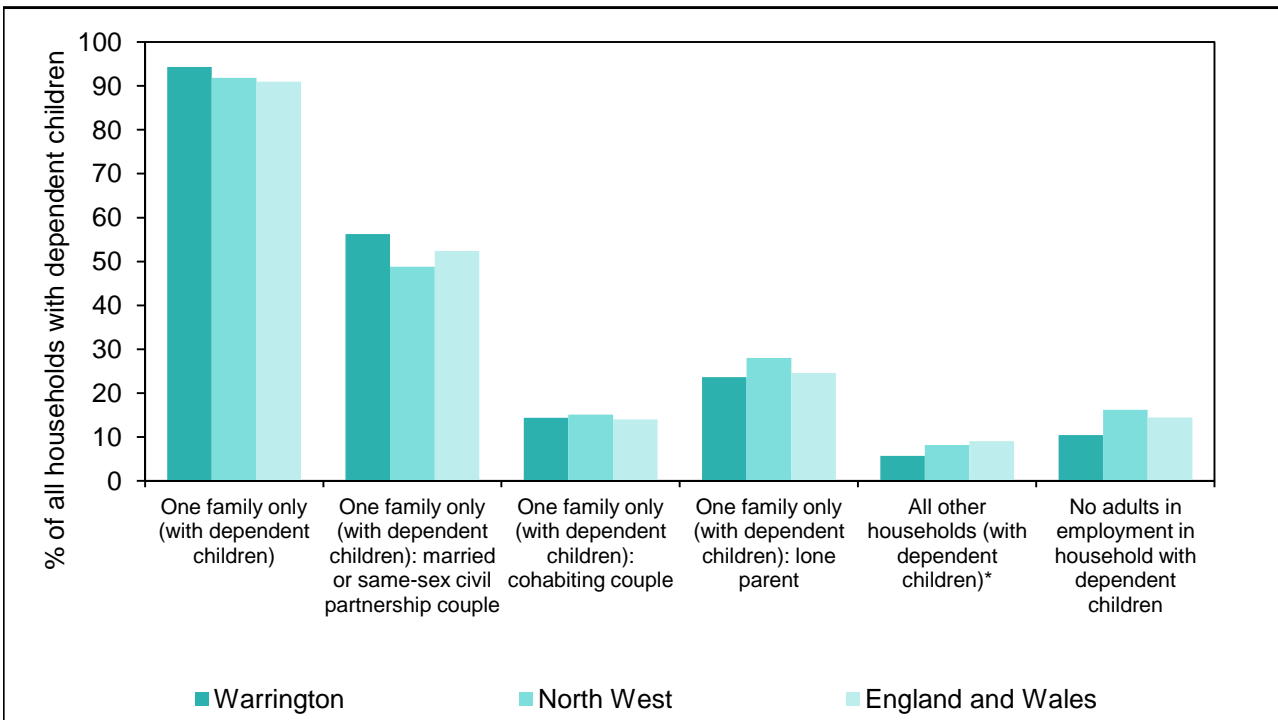
