

Dear Warrington Planning Policy Team

Re: Local Plan preferred Development Option.

My husband & I moved into Moore [REDACTED] ago. Our choice to live here was based upon its rural setting & wonderful village community.

This village community is now under tragic threat, which future generations are unlikely to enjoy.

I wish to make the following objection to all plans to build ~~to~~ on the green belt land that runs from Walton to the very boundary of the village.

1. Warrington has not considered the impact of the "Local Plan" on the natural & historic assets of Moore village. This seems unreasonable when so many of your borough residents also make use of this greenbelt area, along the Bridgewater canal & on Moore Nature Reserve. All of these natural assets to Moore will be destroyed by the 'Local Plan'.

2. Green belt land should be preserved to prevent the merging of towns yet this "plan" would mean that Warington's horses would sit directly alongside Moore/ Thelton horses. This doesn't even take into account the detrimental impact of the traffic on the rural community in Moore.

3. "Port Warington Plan" would further decimate the village of Moore. It would destroy a beautiful natural habitat for migrating birds & our native breeds that ^{are} enjoyed by Warington & Thelton residents alike. Furthermore, the lives of Moore residents would be blighted by the noise & industrial visual destruction of a larger port on this site.

4. Since moving into Moore village finding a doctor or dentist through the NHS was a difficult task as the current shortage of health workers & doctors in Britain has been recognised by the government. The "Local Plan" will only exacerbate this problem further. 2 of my friends recently were turned away from Warington maternity suite & had to travel to Chester to give birth (which I am sure was not in their birthing plan, provided by a Warington midwife). This also demonstrates how the services in Warington are already at breaking point & would not be able to cope with

more houses.

5. The government has also predicted that by the year 2050 there will likely be civil unrest due to food & water shortages. The land that the "local Plan" proposes to build on is currently used for agricultural purposes that will help to provide both Walton & Warndon residents with the food stocks that will soon become more valuable. This is an asset that I think should be very seriously considered before embarking on the "Plan".

It is with sadness that I admit that many local residents & I (from both Moore & Walton) are already looking at alternative places to live. This will further damage the local community spirit.

Please carefully consider my objections & those of other local residents before you irreversibly destroy green belt land & a local village. Not something that I would wish to become my legacy!
