

**Good Morning** 

We are resident at Lymm and there is a proposal to build 240 "affordable" houses on the green belt agricultural land directly behind our house.

For reference it is R18-076 on your plans.

We in Lymm struggle now to get a Doctors or Dental appt and this of course would impact massively if 240 (and up to 500) households were added into this.. Currently with Brookfield surgery it is a 2 week wait to see a GP - ridiculous.

Do you plan to build a further surgery - not according to your colleagues who hosted the Lymm Village Hall discussion day.

Our schools are surely at capacity anyhow, both my children went through local primary schools and then on to Lymm High, but classes are already full.

Do you plan to build/ extend schooling?

Again not so according to information provided on the same day.

This once thriving village had 4 banks, 2 building societies and at least 2 post offices but now we have NONE at all within the village centre.

How can this be right for a village this size which is now being primed for massive expansion?

Our transport links are poor enough with a very limited bus service to Altrincham and slightly better service to Warrington but again it is just not good enough so more people are forced to use their cars and the roads around Lymm, particularly at school start/end times are chaotic and quite frankly dangerous due to the sheer volume and lack of parking causing households to have driveways blocked etc.

With regards the actual land, it is currently green belt which we believe is protected? Have you moved the goal posts to accommodate your aims here? The land is farmed and local produce is grown and sold here. Removing this land is removing part of our village and agricultural identity. Surely this is the heritage we should be preserving and passing on to future generations.

This is our plea to preserve this land and not build these properties here but if they do have to be built somewhere then we urge you to look at other sites which perhaps could take the extra traffic etc as we are already fronted by the incredibly busy A56 and getting out of junctions is difficult enough.

Preserve our green belt and try to keep our village heritage and agricultural identity.

I hope you take time to read all objections from locals and consider very carefully your decisions going forward.
