I wish to object to the Warrington Preferred Local Development Plan/ Option in the strongest possible manner and I am demanding the Plan to be scrapped on the basis of devastation to beautiful greenbelt, urban quality, local distinctiveness and the huge traffic implications.

Our roads are currently already extremely congested and the recent closures of the M6 due to accidents and emergency engineering works which brought our road network to a complete halt, highlights the pressure that already exists on our roads. We can not cope with any more traffic and our bridges certainly can not.

The Council has failed to take into consideration the environmental impact of the PLDP and the threat to the local landscape and wildlife in the area. I urge Warrington Borough Council to confirm in writing that it has followed the mitigation hierarchy and will ensure there is no net loss of biodiversity in order to comply with the National Planning Policy Framework (paragraphs 7, 8, 9, 17, 109, 152) and section 40 of the NERC Act 2006."

With the proposed huge increase in housing and population how does the Council envisage it will be able to cope with the increase in waste and the increase in need for further landfill sites ?

The PDO fails to protect the local heritage, the history and local distinctiveness of Warrington and its local green spaces.. Warrington has a history and culture we, the people of Warrington, are proud of. The Council are failing to listen to not only the needs of the people who live in and love Warrington, but their children and their children's children and the proposed PDO will change the town beyond all recognition .
