I have also completed the online questionnaire.

I have major concerns regarding Wildlife within the area of the proposed new homes, a much loved area where there is unlimited wildlife which generation after generation have enjoyed. The area has only just recovered from the development of Portola and the surrounding areas off Glebe Avenue, Bellhouse Lane, Hazelwood Mews all of which I witnessed and had profound implications on my fathers health.

Not to mention the development of Grappenhall Heys. The decimation of woodlands, meadows, verges, ponds, streams, hedgerows and trees all of which provide resources for mammals, fish, birds and insects. The development of green belt land destroys entire habitates for our native wildlife.

The Health Care in Warrington is already overstretched with very little money available to grow services for any increase in population. It is a well known fact that guidelines have been confirmed in a Government report in July 2017 that Warrington CCG requires improvement. There is also a 57% increase in our GP requirements.

Cancer patients having first treatment in 62 days Warringtons bench mark is only 75% I could go on but I am sure that you have all of these statistics and are aware that the impact of 8,000 further properties will completely overstretch and probably crash the Hospital.

The Air Quality of the area is again a big factor for myself, family and the area.

I already suffer greatly with Asthma and can see that there will be a further deterioration in the air quality when the planned 8,000 houses bring thousands of extra cars in the area every day.

There is clear evidence that motor vehicles make a significant contribution to poorer air quality and congestion. which living near the M6 and M56 we experience every single day with the constant stream of traffic trying to weave its way down the A50 towards the already congested Warrington.

Air Pollution is recognised as a contributing factor in the onset of heart disease and cancer with the health cost about £16 BILLION every year.

This will all increase pressure on the NHS. In Warrington in 2013 4.8% of all deaths were caused by man-made particulate pollution in our air. This figure is worse that the average for the North West.

In 2015 WBC measured levels of harmful air polluters called Nitrous Oxide in 47 places around the town with 60% of the sites measured having pollution levels higher than their own objectives. Again I am sure that you are aware of all the facts and figures and strongly object that you will be adding to this in the area I live with my children and grandchildren.
