#### **Question 1**

Do you have any comments to make about how we've worked out the need for new homes and employment land in Warrington over the next 20 years?

Response: Although the population recognises the distribution element of the mix it does not go far enough to reduce the population for the required area as the extremely high area of some unit do not employ the people represented. This requirement will significantly decrease as further automation and mechanical picking is developed.

This type of employment is low skilled is not consistent with the aspirations laid out in the plan to bring high quality employment.

Changes in the distribution industry will only be consolidated to bigger warehouses employing less and less people and therefore may require more storage area but less people.

Do you have any comments to make about how we've worked out the number of homes and amount of employment land that can be accommodated within Warrington's existing built up areas?

Response: Not enough emphasis has been made on the redevelopment of land already in use for housing.

Have we appropriately worked out the amount of land to be released from the Green Belt, including the amount of land to be 'safeguarded'?

Response: In my view we should be adding to the green belt to protect the outline of our countryside and prevent areas/villages merging into one with no identity.

Do you agree with the new Local Plan Objectives?

Response: The objective have been put together and seem to lead to Warrington becoming part of a ribbon development between Liverpool and Manchester with no identity as a town.
