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Firstly I do not feel that I have even had all of the information to write the level of detailed response that I would like. The consultation events were poor, infrequent and done during school holidays.

I do not feel that the calculations done represent the correct figures of housing that are either required or wanted. I have yet to meet anyone in Warrington who wants to live in a city. If we did we would all move to Liverpool or Warrington and aside from that we don't have the level of commerce or industry to support the view of the bureaucrats who are being led by the £££.

There is no capacity at all on any element of infrastructure in Warrington to support the level of planned housing that is outlined. Whether it be healthcare, transport, education or the road network. As a minimum you would need to build the infrastructure first before you begin on housing or otherwise I imagine it would never get done. The level of conflict that appears to exist from the company doing the planning proposal and Peel Holdings gives serious concern and just stinks of people lining each other's pockets.

But most of all the destruction of the green belt outlined in the plan is abhorrent. There are brown sites and other unused land sites to build housing. Yes the areas around the green belt are desirable, because they are built around green belt!!!

Green belt destruction to be a last resort not the first option over anything else, I thought this was actually illegal.
