2.2	3.6: Homes England representation. SP confirmed that there is currently no representation from Homes England at present due a possible conflict of interest. It is anticipated that Homes England would play a part in any other projects that may result from any Investment funding Warrington may receive.

The Minister was encouraged and supportive of the developments within Warrington, particularly the Bus Depot. 3.1	The Membership was noted and agreed. Additional Members have now been included. The membership could be extended as and when required. Amendment to be made to Nicola Newton's place of work to Warrington & Vale Royal College	KG
4.0	Stronger Towns Fund/Town Deal Merger	
4.1	SP informed the Board of the history around the Stronger Towns Fund. Warrington had not been successful in bidding for this first round of funding but now Warrington have an additional opportunity through the Town Deal Fund. It means that Warrington did not miss out necessarily and the Town Deal could be a preferred option for the town.	
5.0	Secretary of State of Education Letter	
5.1	SP presented the letter which had been received from the Secretary of State for Education.	
5.2	SP believes the letter indicates a strong message from Government. FQ confirmed the message received reflects and permeates within all of the w groups, particularly the Education & Skills group. It was agreed that the Board focus on what has been discussed at the recent Work Stream Themed meetings and identify the cross cutting elements across the groups.	
6.0	Progress to date: Reviewed Documents:	
6.1	Atkins presented the progress to date. It was agreed that KG will circulate the Policy Review document presented at the meeting to the Board.	KG
6.2	The outcome of all four workshops group was presented. The purpose of the workshops held this week was to develop project ideas and gather evidence for the development of the Outline Town Investment Plan.	
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6.3	A strong message was received in all workshops in regard to the strengths of both Liverpool and Manchester. Following discussion, it was agreed that although both Cities should be complemented within the message of the investment plan, it is important that Warrington has its own strength which adds to both economies. It was also agreed that it is important that Warrington's strength and independence should be the primary message.	
6.4	There is a lot happening in Warrington and there is much more to do.  Martin Wood confirmed the Government would think it is important that the City elements are combined within the Investment Plan.	
6.5	It was agreed that the next round of workshops would receive feedback from this meeting to ensure suggestions are considered at the next round of meetings at the end of March. Atkins agreed to report back the following suggestions to the relevant workstream. The workshops were very well attended, bearing in mind the short notice given and was around $80-95\%$

7.2	Martin Woods confirmed the Board appears to be on the right track and to ensure interventions are considered. Hard choices need to be made and the Board need to think about what the package of the project needs to be and whether private sector or public sector investment would also be required. He is happy to follow up on-line with Members of Board.	All

8.1	Laurence Pullan updated the Board on the broad themes. There is an element that communications ensure feedback from the public aligns with what we are delivering. They have identified a number of audiences together with some light touch work around social media which has commenced and is being well received.
