




Dear Sir/Madame. (Copied to Faisal Rashid MP)

I would like to complain in the strongest terms possible about the wanton destruction of Appleton and its surrounding areas of outstanding natural beauty. There is no justification of the scheme you are proposing as there are many more suitable sites available.

The scheme you have proposed is completely out of all proportions to what is required and takes no account of the area's capacity to absorb so many new homes.

Many thousands of vehicles will be trying to go through Lumb Brook Lane, London Road or Knutsford Road.

The drainage scheme alone (to accommodate these future houses and roads) would necessitate a pipe diameter greater than the Lumb Brook underpass beneath the Bridgewater Canal. This alone would require reconfiguring this bridge and drainage works to a cost of many millions of pounds.

The new junction 8 on the M62 already has future development taken into account and offers a much better access point to Manchester and Liverpool.

Some of the land you are looking to destroy is shown in the photographs attached to this email. Please note that all of this land is currently being used for food production (something which will be a precious commodity now that we are leaving Europe).

With this proposal you have decided to destroy some of the most beautiful countryside in the county. The reason for this is so that developers can get the most profit out of this scheme. You need to understand that you are appointed to serve the people, not the profit of private developers.

I hope you reconsider what is basically a profit-driven scheme.
