

I write in connection to the local development plan proposed by WBC. Firstly I think the whole consultation process has been a disgrace with many residents only finding out about the plan last minute.

I have examined the proposed plan (albeit somewhat confusing). I wish to strongly object to the development of the greenbelt land on cherry lane lymm.

Lymm over the past few years has seen a huge increase in development and is now struggling to cope with increase in traffic, schools are unable to accommodate pupils and the doctors have way over capacity. The village is loosing its identity.

The proposed infilling of the land on cherry lane would ruin the character of the area and have a massive impact on the wildlife in the area. Cherry lane has seen lots of development over the years and hasn't got the infrastructure to cope. The volume of traffic has way increased and as you will be aware this is a high collision road to add the the volume could have severe consequences.

I would propose alternative brownfield sites in lymm would be considered over greenbelt. In particular the land off rush green road that's currently occupied by local small business including gyms and health food cafe.

I understand that their has to be additional housing but would hope common sense would prevail over where these would be located
