Tonight i came across a poster in Grappenhall regarding proposed plans for the railway embankment that runs directly across the top of Grammar School Road in Latchford. I can not begin to express how stressful this has made me feel.

In the past you have expressed to residents that you would hold a meeting should any plans be proposed for the embankment. Latchford is a relatively poor area of warrington and has no parish council which I feel puts us at a great disadvantage in opposing any plans.

The effects of turning the embankment into a road would be devastating not only for the environment - loss of habitats, increased pollution & reduced vegetation, but also on wellbeing- increased noise, traffic and reduction in tress and wildlife. Not to mention the possibility of reduction in property value or compulsory purchase!
