#### Addendum to Comments on the Warrington Draft Plan

#### Green Belt

The Green Belt should be protected as strongly as possible. There is little point in designating a Green Belt if a significant part of it is sacrificed whenever increased Development is required. If the Plan period was for 15 years then significantly less Green Belt would be required as less housing would be needed which in any event is overestimated in the Plan.

#### Highways

The current road infrastructure is already insufficient to cope with existing traffic in South Warrington. Increased Housing in the Garden Suburb would cause chaos without significant road improvements. The town suffers from the 3 Waterway barriers of the Mersey, the Manchester Ship Canal and the Bridgewater Canal.

A new crossing of the Mersey is included in the plan which will help the reduce congestion at Bridge Foot but does nothing to deal with the problems caused by the Ship Canal or the Bridgewater Canal. In fact the new crossing will certainly attract and increase traffic through the minor roads to the South of the Mersey which are not designed to take it.

The improvement and /or replacement of the cantilever bridge makes no provision for increased access roads and all traffic will still use the existing suburban roads. There appears to be no thought at all about the problems already caused by the Bridgewater Canal. At peak times not only is the A49 through Stockton Heath heavily congested but also Lumb Brook Road under the single track underbridge and Windmill Lane and Red Lane which has a single file pinch point and 18<sup>th</sup> Century single file Bridge over the Bridgewater Canal suffer heavy congestion.

Although the Plan suggests increase use of public transport, cycling, and walking it is totally unrealistic to expect people to give up their cars There will probably be at least 2 or more cars per household in the newly constructed dwellings.

At one point there was a suggestion of the development of a new high level bridge to the west of Warrington to cross the Ship Canal and the Mersey but that does not appear in the Plan. Indeed the towns traffic problems would be greatly eased if a highway could be constructed from the M56 to the M62 to take out the problems of the Bridgewater Canal, the Ship Canal, and the River Mersey. No substantial further development to the South of the town should take place until such a connection is in place. The proposed Walton Development could well inhibit any such development and should be reconsidered.

#### General infrastructure

Although there is mention of the provision of schools and Health Centres the Council cannot promise that these will be provided. Indeed there is already a national problem caused by the shortage of medical and dental services and the existing schools in South Warrington are full. What assurance can be given that already stretched facilities will be supported by new provision?
