Buildings and Structures of Locally Important Architectural and Historic Interest (Locally Listed Buildings)

Please consider adding the following to the Local list.

Kinknall Hall Farm, moat and barn

This farm contained Kinknall Hall, a moated manor. The Hall is no longer there although much of the moat remains. There is also a barn, built round about 1800.

Although the de Kinknalls had land in the area in the 14th Century it was the Urmstons in the 17th Century who built Kinknall Hall (sometimes called Kingnall). The area is shown on the 1849 OS Lancashire and Furness map. It also shows the farm access to Hob Hey Lane next to New Kinknall Hall.

The farm is part of an area of land nominated in the Call for Sites, although not promoted in the Draft Local Plan. Its History needs recognition, and the whole site is of interest and needs archaeological investigation and protection.
