To whom it may concern.

I object in the strongest terms to the local plan for the following reasons:-

Green belt land should be built on last, not first. We should use brownfield sites first. Fiddlers ferry will be decommissioned in the next few years and has not been considered in the plan. Once green belt land is lost, it is lost forever. Even worse, no case has been made for release of the green belt and the plan does not meet 4 out of 5 of the criteria for "special circumstances" release from the green belt.

I [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] moved to Warrington for its open green spaces. I live in the village which is a conservation area and do not want to be surrounded by a sprawling housing estate when there is no economic plan to justify such a large- scale expansion.

There is no infrastructure in place to facilitate the building of so many houses. For example, doctors, schools, hospital beds, roads. The pollution from more traffic will put the future of our children at risk. The air quality in Warrington is poor already without adding to it with more cars due to all the proposed housing and worse the extra HGV lorries that would come from the 6/56 proposals for employment land.
