From the early days of the New Town there have been no plans to provide the level of infrastructure necessary to service this area (and those that were planned nearby – the Northern Expressway – have been discarded). Again it is an area of open space that is threatened, a lung for North Warrington that provides a home for wildlife, a space for locals to enjoy and a sink for the fumes from the M62. Not as Mr Griffiths said at the appeal a deprived area!

Satnam have had a policy of stalling the environment in Peel Hall by not using this land for any agricultural purpose at all, (it was NEVER their intention) and spraying and rough ploughing to provide 'evidence' that this area is not of value to nature. Allowing any development here will not only remove a valuable green space but increase the infrastructure pressure on the existing localities and that in turn will impact upon the mental and physical well being of those who already live here. The wider arguments have been well rehearsed in the various planning meetings and are still relevant.

We the residents of Warrington Reject your use of our green spaces it will be devastating!

We Reject your 'Consultation Process' as it is not viable.

We Reject that the 'Representation process' you offer as it is too complicated and has a deadline that is before the re-election of this council.

If you back this plan then you are NOT speaking for the residents of Warrington
