



In common with everyone I have spoken with about the proposed plan there are common and serious concerns.

Loss of precious green belt land. The development by the then New Town Development Corporation saw the removal of brown belt at the south of Old Pewterspear lane. This was accepted in the knowledge that the remaining land stretching to the M52 would remain as green belt land.

Since moving to Warrington years ago, I have witnessed a progressive increase in road traffic to the point of heavy congestion and sometimes gridlock particularly on the A49 I/we contend that that the plan is ill considered and not justified on several counts. Our overriding concern is the loss of precious green belt land in the buffer area up to the M52 motorway.
