The plan is unsound. It does not address the needs of Warrington, as it is proposing to build far more houses than are needed, even by central government estimates.

The transport infrastructure in South Warrington, particularly around Stockton Heath and the A49 are already inadequate for the current traffic volumes. Journey times through Stockton Heath are over long already, and would become impossible with the proposed extra 5000+ houses being built. - Already one jam on the local or Motorway networks, or a canal bridge opening, brings the whole area to a standstill, sometime for hours. Congestion causing pollution on a grand scale. So It is not a Sound plan to greatly increase the number of houses, without including a bypass for Stockton Heath, and an additional river / Bridgewater / Ship canal crossing that could take traffic off the A49. But as this would mean removing current housing, and would just push the bottlenecks into the centre of Warrington, It too is unsound. Obviously I don't have figures to quantify these points, but I don't need them - Anyone living in the area for any length of time can see that it is so. The limitation the existing road network having to cross two canals, and the Mersey make it impractical to add massive housing developments in this area of Warrington. Really its a no brainer.... Just spend some there time and look.

Green belt is precious, once lost it is lost forever, this proposal is eating into that resource, when its not needed. Warrington has loads of brown belt areas that would be improved by housing. Use that rather than ruining the attractive parts of the local area. We need our countryside to fight climate change, and the preservation of diversity of animal and plant live.

The plan boasts it is creating a country park, when really it was countryside anyway.... Its says Garden suburb, as if that were an improvement on 'countryside' - which it just isn't -
