



There is no justification for the size of the development. Sites are for the financial benefit of developers and will disappoint customers because the infrastructure will not be there to provide new residents with the amenities suggested by advertisement, for example the good schools in the area are over subscribed so places may not be available and the roads network is already saturated at busy times. These point make the plan unsound.

I do not believe the plan is legally compliant because green belt land is being used, my understanding was that green belt should only be used in exceptional circumstances.

There is nothing exceptional in this plan therefore it is not justified. In fact the Garden Development Framework contains several inaccuracies, one being the number of secondary schools. Another is the inclusion of the BUPA (now Spire) hospital as if it is a universal health facility. This is a serious oversight as the area has a small number of doctors surgeries all of which are full. The plan is unsound due to the lack of proposed facilities for healthcare, community, leisure and shopping.

The plan is unsound because it describes a small grassed area as a country park, this is misleading. There are several ancient trees in the area that require protection. A country park should be a site of woodland and meadows from where a person can be immersed in nature and not see buildings, this sounds I ke a good idea however, the size of it is disappointing and I would argue the lack of green spaces makes the plan unsound due to a lack of thought in relation to the well being of the residents.

The development is unsound because it will significantly change the character of south Warrington.

The plan is unsound and not legally compliant as it will negatively impact upon the air quality in South Warrington as it has made unrealistic comments about people walking and cycling to work in the area. In reality this plan will mean more congestion and pollution. The plan is unsound because it is seeking to build homes with and hope that other facilities follow.
